What's happening in Term 4?

Maths

This term, we will be revisiting and applying our number skills, like place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and fractions. We will also be diving into exciting mathematical investigations that will have us exploring chance, data and measurement. We will use our problem-solving skills, working together to crack some challenging puzzles!

Literacy

Our daily literacy programme will continue to focus on building awareness of letters and sounds via our structured literacy programme. In writing, this term we'll zoom in on compound sentences, paragraphing and sentence openings across different genres. We'll end our term with a focus on letter writing.

Kaupapa Māori

We will learn new karakia this term, as well as greetings for the festive season.

We will continue building our reo, with a focus on asking and answering: 'What is this/that?' 'He aha tēnei/tēna?' and then move on to describing the location of items in the classroom: Where is the pen? The pen is on the table. 'Kei hea te pene? Kei runga te pene i te tēpu.
