## WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS TERM

### Ko Wai Au

This term Ngahere tamariki will be doing Ko Wai Au. Ko Wai Au is a programme which aims to increase resilience among Year 4 to 8 tamariki. Ko Wai Au is delivered in 24, forty minute sessions covering three strands: physical; cultural; and social. Ko Wai Au is influenced by the Rock and Water Programme, teaching tamariki that they have a choice in how they approach any situation; either a Rock approach (non-negotiable stance), or a Water approach (a more flexible response). Either approach may be appropriate depending on the situation. We are very lucky to have the external experts come in to deliver this programme.

Homework

The expectations of homework are listed below:

**Maths-Whizz** - 3x 15 minute sessions a week on top of what your child does in class. If this isn't possible at homes we wanted

computers available before school.

**Reading daily** - We encourage your child to read daily (for at least 15 minutes) at home with personal choice books. Each week your child will bring home their reading log book

# Relationships & <u>Sexuality Education</u>

In Term 3, Rākau and Ngahere will be running our Relationships and Sexuality Education programme, as part of the NZ Health curriculum. Our programme follows the 'Navigating the Journey' resource created by New Zealand Family planning, which caters different content depending on student age. We will have lessons twice a week which will be taught by our senior school kaiako.

The following themes will be covered over the term:

Theme 1 - Establishing a positive learning environment Theme 2 - Who am I? Theme 3 - Relationships Theme 4 - Growing and changing Theme 5 - Staying safe

#### Aotearoa Histories

This term our Inquiry focus will be on Aotearoa Histories. We will be learning about different leadership styles in NZ and around the world, Māori leadership (past and present, Colonial leadership in NZ (past & present), and Modern elections & campaigning. This inquiry topic will be lead through all areas of learning (Maths, Reading, Writing, Arts etc).

We look forward to exploring this topic in classes with our tamariki. Be sure to look out for their key learning displayed on Seesaw!

#### Seesaw

During the term your child will share posts about what they are doing in class, in a range of curriculum areas. Whole school Seesaw reporting will look like:

Term 1 & 3 - Reading & Writing post showing photographic evidence of your child's learning

**Term 2 & 4** - Maths post showing photographic evidence of your child's learning.

A levelled report will be posted on Seesaw for each child at the end of Term 2 and 4. This will show your child's levels in Reading, Writing and Maths, as well as a general comment from their teacher.
